# **Nursery: Colour and Light**



### **Prime Areas: links to theme**

#### **Personal Social and Emotional**

- · Circle time games
- · Turn taking games
- · Sharing the All About Me Bag
- Washing hands & personal hygiene
- Identifying emotions and how to regulate them
- NSPCC PANTS Rule
- Oral Health and how to take care of our teeth

### **Communication and Language**

- Telling stories and dictating stories
- Talking about experiences and ideas
- Singing songs and rhymes
- Beginning to join in with repetitive refrains in books
- Retelling events in the correct order
- Innovating stories to create new ones e.g. changing the characters and setting

## **Physical Development**

- Hand-eye co-ordination activities and engaging in tactile/malleable activities to develop hand and finger strength and pencil control
- Begin representing letters in their names by making marks on paper, in sand/salt, on whiteboards/chalkboards.
- Matching their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting. For
  example, they decide whether to crawl, walk or run across a plank, depending on its
  length and width.
- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues.

# **Specific Areas:**

#### **Mathematics**

- Representing, comparing and learning about the compositions of numbers 1-3
- Exploring and creating pictures using circles and triangles
- Identifying, continuing and creating simple patterns
- Predicting, measuring and comparing the capacity of different containers
- Comparing and ordering weight

### Literacy

- Engaging in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary
- · Mark making/creating symbols to convey meaning e.g. lists, labels, cards and letters
- Exploring rhyme and rhyming words
- Playing rhyming and sound discrimination games to develop phonological awareness
- Counting or clapping syllables in words
- Begin writing some or their entire name.

### **Understanding the World**

- Noticing colour and light changes in our environment
- Talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary e.g. observing changes in colour experiments
- Exploring light and dark e.g. explore how you can shine light through some materials, but not others (shadows)
- Continuing to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people and understanding significant festivals they celebrate e.g. Diwali, Hanukkah, Christmas

## **Expressive Arts and Design**

- Exploring shape and pattern using different resources
- Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings, like happiness, sadness, fear, etc.
- Explore colour and colour mixing.
- · Modelling using salt dough
- Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas.
- Developing complex stories using small world equipment like animal sets, dolls and dolls houses, etc.
