Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been another great week of learning across the school and we have saved many of the images of what has been happening in classes across the school in the year group pages towards the end of the newsletter. We will, though numbers of children affected by the pandemic continue to grow, continue our commitment to our rich and vibrant curriculum and for those children self-isolating we will be offering a remote access learning offer on Google Classroom.

A reminder that our Tuesday class assemblies are now all virtual, at least until the end of this half term, after this point we will review where we are with the pandemic data. This means the first virtual assembly will be 2 Blue on Tuesday 25th January. We will send out links to this in due course and the rest of the years dates can be seen on page 7 of the newsletter.

Can I firstly thank all families for their continued Food Bank donations over the past few weeks but also remind everyone that we continue to collect for this worthy cause and any donations can be left in the reception atrium.

I would also like to announce Islington's annual Inter Faith Calendar competition this week with details on page 3. The theme this year is "Unity in Diversity: We Are One." We have previously had children's work chosen for the calendar and it would great if this success could be further enhanced this year!

Thank you to all families for letting us know when their children have become infected with Covid-19 over the past week but we continue to strongly encourage that with the Covid-19 pandemic deepening that all families with children 5 and over to consider testing their children on a twice weekly basis to protect our local school community by taking two LFD tests at home. These should be taken 3-5 days apart which is the same as all school staff who do these on a Sunday and Wednesday. This measure has been shown to be highly effective at reducing the spread of the virus in secondary schools and by taking this important action this term we can help to keep the number of cases low at Ashmount. This is also an approach encouraged by Public Health Islington to do bi-weekly routine lateral flow testing as an important and effective way to help reduce the spread of the infection across our community.

All tests are free and can be accessed in the following ways:

The latest guidance change that comes into effect on Monday will mean that both children and adults who have Covid-19 will be able to end their self-isolation period at the start of day 6 if you get 2 negative rapid lateral flow test results on days 5 and 6 and do not have a temperature. Tests must be at least 24 hours apart. If either test is positive, wait 24 hours before testing again.






