Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been great to see o many of our children return this week and we have had a really exciting week of learning but as importantly the atmosphere across the school has as ever been calm with a bubbling excitement of learning.

I want to remind all families about attendance in school during term time is compulsory whether it is the first day of term, the last day of term on anywhere in between. The school can only permit absence during term time in exceptional circumstances— a family bereavement, a family weeding or other significant family occasion. I will write this week to those families who returned late to school and I am in the interim seeking advice from the local authority, but it is highly likely you will receive a fine. Every day at school for child is essential both academically and socially. Whilst I appreciate that costs to travel are significantly lower outside of term time that cannot be a reason to miss school. This similarly applies to my whole school staff team who are similarly here for the whole academic year and take any breaks they have planned outside of these dates—we expect the same of all of our families.

Can I also remind families that the only cars that are allowed on site are those with my express permission and that is for families with children with significant Special Education Need or for parents with disabilities.

I am attaching several attachments today, one from the local authority advising about the support they are offering during the cost of living crisis, As a school we will continue to support families through this time and please remember Peter our School Home Support officer is available to talk you through any help you may need. We will also continue to collect for the Muswell Hill and St. Mary's Food Banks—any items you can spare can be left at the main office.

A reminder that we also begin our Parent Presentations this week where we talk through this terms class learning offer. These will take place in person and will be based in one of the year group classrooms. Please join us if you can—they run from 9 a.m. until about 9:30 a.m.

A diary date to let you know we have our first Bring An Adult To School Day on Friday 3rd October and it would be great if you could come and join us, firstly in the main hall from 9 a.m. and then into the classrooms for some creative learning with your children until 10:30 a.m.

Please remember that the school will be closed next Monday to all children as their will be a national Bank Holiday the State Funeral of Queen Elizabeth II. We held a special assembly to mark the passing of Queen Elizabeth II on Friday for children from YearI to year 6 using age appropriate information and slides.

Finally, the second email I send today will contain our half termly learning documents to help you support your child's learning at home.

Volunteer in Ashmount with Number Champions

Be part of Number Champions, the charity helping children to learn and enjoy maths - including in Ashmount Primary School from November 2020.

Our trained volunteers provide one-to-one support to children who have fallen behind in maths. Through games and other activities they help children to develop skills, confidence, and enjoyment in maths.

Young children who find maths difficult often develop a "can't do, won't do" attitude, and never properly re-engage with the subject. This can impact their whole education. Early intervention can help them learn skills and gain the confidence to participate fully in class.

If you'd enjoy volunteering regularly for one and a half hours each week during the school day, and would find it rewarding to help 6 to 8 year-olds, you could be one of our in-school volunteers.

As well as bringing enthusiasm, you will need to be competent with addition, subtraction, multiplication and division – and also be confident in explaining them.

We provide training on how to interact with children in a school setting, on the early years maths syllabus, and on creative and fun ways to engage young children with maths.

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
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
