Then in Nursery, we have appointed Elizabeth Norcup, who currently works in Year 5 but has worked across the school and will replace Kirsten in Nursery as we look to recruit specifically for the role by February. I am sure you will welcome both colleagues into their new roles in January

Finally, I trust you will all have a peaceful and restful Christmas break and I look forward to seeing you all on Wednesday 4th January.


