Dear Parents and Carers,

Just a reminder that on Wednesday we will see the first day of the national NEU strike action by the teaching staff. Given that all class based teachers will take action that day the school will be closed. Katie and Shajia have contacted families who would like to collect a packed lunch in lieu of a school meal that day. The offer is still open and if you would like to access it please let the office know.

I know that many of you regularly donate to the Food Bank collection at school, as well as other organisations external to the school that are supporting those in need during the ongoing cost of living crisis. But I just wanted to remind those families who can support the school in this worthy initiative that if each family who were able to donated one item each week to the collection box we could do a weekly drop to the two Food Banks we currently support.

A reminder and update on our challenge to limit vehicle access to Crouch Hill Park. Firstly, there are only IO families that have permission to access the park by car—they are those who have children on the SEND register or adults who have a disability themselves. Secondly, we are in close liaison with the local authority to look at possibilities of making the site safer—the options being reviewed currently are re-installing an electronic barrier and also looking at an installing ANPR system to charge those illegally entering the site. I will update you over the coming weeks with where we are with these initiatives but in the meantime please do not drive onto the site without my permission to do so. This keeps everyone safe, children, families, staff and the wider community.

Finally, thank you to the parents who have decided to stand in our Parent Governor elections—we are running the voting process electronically for these appointments and to ensure we have all details correct we will start the election process on Monday morning when the candidate statements will be issued and the electronic voting access. The updated schedule is as follows:

- Ballot papers and election statements will then be sent home on Monday, 30th January 2023.
- The closing date for the return of ballot papers will be 12pm Friday, 10th February 2023.

Children's Occupational Therapy Drop in

As parents of children receiving occupational therapy may be aware, the local authority are prioritising Reception and Year I children who have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP). They have sent schools information on their drop in clinics should you require advice from an occupational therapist. Parents do not need to have a referral to access this.

What is the offer?

A 20 minute virtual appointment (telephone or video) every Wednesday. Please call 0203-316-1892 to book.

This is a one-off appointment for advice. There is no limit to how often you would like to attend.

An opportunity to speak to an occupational therapist (OT) for advice regarding the child's/young person's development, sensory needs, and self-help skills.

Support to help you work with the child/young person to achieve their functional goals (e.g., dressing skills, scissor skills, handwriting, cutlery skills etc.).

SENDIASS information sessions for parents and carers

Markfield Haringey have sent information on sessions held by SENDIASS to support parents and carers of SEN and those who have an EHCP. (See attached leaflet for more information.

The Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information Advice and Support Services (SENDIASS) offer information, advice and support for parents and carers of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). SENDIASS is a free, confidential and impartial service for parents and carers, children and young people (up to 25 years).

Online Safety

In light of growing concerns about children's safety and the internet, Islington are offering parents a family Digital Online Safety workshop (see attached poster).

It is really important that parents are aware of all the dangers and where to get help if needed should they have any concerns or issues.

The school will be holding online safety lessons across the school from EYFS to Year 6 on Wednesday 8th February which is also Safer Internet Day. We are fortunate enough to have the support and guidance from an Islington Computing Lead who will be supporting the delivery of these lessons.




