



If children are known to the Social Communication Team (SCT) without EHCPs, parents can access virtual training and attend a 'step up' meeting. They may also be eligible for direct intervention sessions once they've watched the virtual training and tried the strategies: Advice and Strategies (whittington nhs uk) & also offer the Occupational Therapy drop-in clinic for parents Mainstream Schools Occupational Therapy Resources (whittington nhs uk).

We have discussed setting up a 'parent surgery' where parents can attend a training session with her on colourful semantics or pre-teaching vocabulary, one afternoon at school.
