Adult Child Interaction and Early Communication



Women in STEM!:

On Wednesday 15th November, eight Ashmount students had the fantastic opportunity to visit Gillespie Primary School to celebrate women in STEM.

The group voted to focus on Joan Beauchamp Procter: the first woman to curate the reptile house at ZSL. She was a zoologist. Specifically, a herpetologist – someone who studies reptiles and amphibians.

She used her artistic skills to design attractive recreations of the animals' habitats which improved their wellbeing and lifespan.

The group researched Joan and made posters about her. Then, they planned a habitat designing activity to take to Gillespie. The group had to lead the activity and explain to children from other schools how to complete the task.

They then had the opportunity to explore activities from other schools based on women scientists such as making DNA helixes out of sweets (Rosalind Franklin) and creating salt dough fossils (Mary Anning).


