

Sensory Differences in Children



What do sensory differences look like in children?

Children with low sensory thresholds present as being 'over-responsive' to sensory input. They can be easily overwhelmed in noisy, busy environments such as shops, birthday parties or noisy classrooms. They may not be able to tolerate labels in clothes or their hair being brushed. Children with high sensory thresholds present as 'under-responsive' to sensory input. They need a higher intensity or frequency of sensory input before they notice it.
