Online Safety Policy

Ashmount has an **updated Online Safety Policy (attached)** using the template provided by LGfL. This year, they have made changes to reflect trends they have seen over the past year and especially in the light of changes to **Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023**.

Parents and staff need to be aware of the risks associated with online activity and how easy it is for a child's safety to be compromised. Alongside this is evidence showing the long term effect inappropriate use of technology can have on a child's emotional wellbeing and mental health.

All parents will be asked to sign an AUP (Acceptable User Policy) to support the school in keeping your child/ren safe. Children in KSI and KS2 will also be required to sign an AUP. [There is a modified version for some of our SEND children which uses visuals and symbols to support their understanding]. Staff and governors have all signed their AUPs in order to be compliant with government legislation. (All of the


