Dear Parents and Carers,

I trust you have all had a restful half term break! Firstly, a huge thank you to Ashmount Together for organising the end of term Valentine's disco, the families that joined us had a wonderful time and the children got to let their hair down after a busy half term of learning.



I wanted to remind all families as we plan to start our second half of the spring term about the protocols for resolving any child disagreements at school. These must, at all times, be dealt with by school staff and not through parents approaching any child directly. Firstly, to approach a child directly would be a clear breach of safeguarding protocols but additionally induces fear for any child involved and anxiety for their peers. As importantly, this is likely to lead to other external agency involvement as the school seeks to protect the children in its care. With this in mind I am today issuing the school's Parent Code of Conduct, which was agreed by the school's Governing Board. Please help us to keep everyone safe by making the right choices around your own behaviours whether in person, or via social media, only by modelling the right behaviours ourselves will we see them from our children.

A reminder that we are switching to our Arbor online communications system and to sign up to this as soon as you can. Shajia and Katie will reach out to those yet to sign up to help you with any teething issues.

We will have our termly Parent Conferences in mid March and the office will send out details on how to book your place this week. It's really important that you book an appointment so we can share your child's learning with you but also suggest ways you can help at home to further embed their learning routines. I am including the dates below so you can put them in your diary!

Finally, as I am sure you are aware, we are rightly proud of our school learning we cover each year to promote equality and diversity around ageism, gender, identity and race .
