



It is that time of year when thoughts about transitions can cause parental and child anxiety. There is a lot to consider and we don't want you to feel overwhelmed by it all.

Year 6 to Year 7

This half term I have organised all the secondary school transition meetings for our Year 6 pupils this includes those out of borough. I will also be attending the Primary/Secondary Transition Conference on 25th June. This is an additional opportunity for me to share all the information about your child so that they have the best possible start to Year 7!

Nursery to Reception

Our EYFS Lead, Ross in RG, attended the Nursery/Reception transition conference and has conducted all the home visits for EYFS. This is so that WE have all the necessary information about any child is new to the school to make their transition smooth. We also do visit to the respective nursery settings.

Reception to Year I

Reception children conduct an environmental walk for their classes moving up to Year I because we recognise this is a big leap from Reception to Year I in many ways.
