Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared

Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Wellbeing tip of the week - mindful walking

Walking has many health-related benefits including improving heart and lung health, reducing stress and maintaining a healthy weight. Mindful walking helps to bring focus and calm to your day. The key is to pay attention to the experience of walking — the sights and sounds of your surroundings, the sensation of your feet on the ground and the rhythm of your movement. Here's how

Pick a time when you can practice mindful walking for at least 5 minutes, ideally as part of a regular occasion like walking the dog or going to work.

Notice the physical sensation of walking and the sights and sounds of the world around you as you move. Try adjusting your pace and notice how it might feel different.

Help focus your mind by counting your steps or repeating "left, right, left, right" as you walk


