



# Should I keep my

# child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Threadworms	Slapped cheek

If you have any concerns about your child whether this is social, emotional, learning or communication needs, please speak to your child's teacher or me. We can arrange a meeting in person or online if it is easier. I would like to remind you about all the support that can be offered in school and professionals via a wide range of external agencies. They all require referrals through school (me):

CAMHS – Neurodevelopmental Team and SEMH Pathways (social, emotional and mental health) - they are not just about assessing children for neurodiversity.

School Wellbeing Service (part CAMHS) – supporting emotional regulation in the home Place2Be – 1 to 1 counselling

PIPT – service from Place2Be – personalised parent program to support behaviour management in the home

ELSA – emotional literacy support – Salman Ali has been trained by the Educational Psychology Service and is now an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant

Educational Psychologist

School Home Support – does what it says on the tin & so much more!!

Early Help (this has nothing to do with social services – this has been a common misconception) – Bright Start and Bright Futures

School nurse

The Bridge Outreach – for autistic children

Samuel Rhodes Outreach – for learning difficulties

Islington Dyslexia Network

Speech and Language therapy and Occupational therapy offer in clinic support unless a child has a specific diagnosis of SLCN/autism/DLD/DCD (speech and language needs) DLD (developmental language disorder) DCD(development coordination disorder) or have an EHCP which states this provision.
