



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Hidden Harms of Social Media.

Dear parents and carers,

This week I have made the focus of my Inclusion page to be on the Hidden Harms of Social Media.

There has been a stack of research showing the harm social media is doing to children's mental health. But it is not just a mental health issue it is a whole child problem.



Excessive screen time on smart devices is linked to a 30% higher risk of developing short-sightedness.

Did you know that children who use screens for more than an hour are more likely to develop problems like 'text neck' as well as wrist and back problems?

Increased screen time is linked to speech delay in children.

A & E departments are dealing with an increasing number of incidents they believe are related to social media such as: **self-harm**, **dangerous pranks and knife crimes**.

There has been a **big rise is skin conditions** due to girls as young as 7 watching videos of 12-step beauty routines using products that contain retinol which is very damaging for young skin.

Eating disorders have 'gone through the roof' with a significant increase in the number of boys diagnosed with **body dysmorphia** (a mental condition which affects how they see their body).

Most children don't start by trying to find this content, it ends up in their feed and within hours they are taken down a rabbit hole. The same can be said for adults I am sure you will agree!

One piece of advice given to parents is that if you can only do one thing, don't let your child have any devices in the bedroom. Hyperstimulation in the brain before bed, worrying about notifications, really interferes with sleep. Lots of studies show **higher social media usage is directly linked to lower sleep duration**. An obvious statement but If your child is tired then they cannot possibly focus in class.

Finally, research shows that children who have excessive screen time (over an hour) are more likely to have behavioural issues.
