NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

- Are you on our school app Arbor yet? Arbor is an easy way for us to send you quick and/or urgent updates, and for you to see key information about the school day and your child's attendance. If you haven't signed up yet, please download the app 'Arbor' on your phone, and ask Katie and Millie in the school office for your log in details.
- After school club bookings need to be made and confirmed before your child attends the after school club session via Arbor or the school office. If no slots are available when you try to book a session, this likely means after school club is full. If your child has not been booked in for a session, we will call you to come and collect your child. For changes or cancellations please call the school office. For urgent contact with the after school club team during after school club hours call 07426 861 050.
- A polite reminder that only cars with pre-authorised permission are allowed on the school site in Crouch Hill Park for drop offs and pick ups. This is a condition of having the school on this site and must be adhered to. This currently includes a total of 6 families so there should be no issues with congestion on the school site at any time.
- Please remember that children are not permitted to take holiday days on school days. All holidays during term will be marked as unauthorised absences unless prior permission is given e.g. for a major family event such as a wedding or funeral.

- **Let's Talk is a short-term service for children and young people aged up to 18 who have displayed problematic sexual behaviour (PSB). Let's Talk also works with the parents/carers, taking a whole family approach.**
- **Let's Talk helps children understand healthy boundaries, emotions, and relationships in a safe and age-appropriate way. Working together with children, and their parents/carers, to enable them to go on and experience healthy and expected sexual development and expression that is appropriate for their age, stage of development and context.**

Read Write Inc. starts in the first term of Reception and continues until a child progresses to our English program.

When children are ready they will bring home 'book bag books' to enjoy with parents and carers and reinforce their learning. Children should be reading at home independently or with an adult for a minimum of 15 minutes every day. Books will be changed in class according to a child's need. We also expect Reading Record books to be returned to class twice each week. Please remember to return all books sent home.

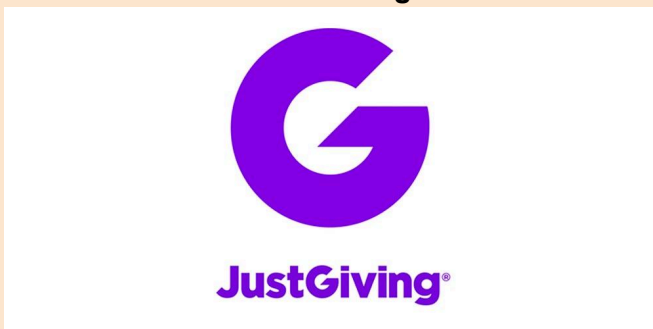

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
