Dyslexia

Dyslexia varies from person to person, and no two people with dyslexia will have the same strengths and weaknesses. It often co-occurs with related conditions, such as dyspraxia, dyscalculia, and attention deficit disorder.

Dyslexic individuals often have difficulty processing and remembering information. Ten percent of the population is believed to be dyslexic, that's one in 10, but the condition is often poorly understood.

Many people find that dyslexia can bring many positive gifts, such as exceptional creativity, imagination, communication skills, problem-solving, and thinking outside the box. However, people with dyslexia may also have difficulty processing and remembering information they see and hear, which can affect their literacy skills development.

Dyslexia can also affect other areas, such as organisational skills, numeracy, language, motor coordination, and concentration. Dyslexia can range from mild to severe. It often runs in families and is a life-long learning (neurological) difference.

Dyslexia has nothing to do with intelligence; it affects people from all cultures and all walks of life.

Chicken Club is a group of amazing volunteers who help care for the school chickens over the weekends.

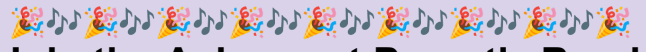
Any families with a child currently attending Ashmount can get involved.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

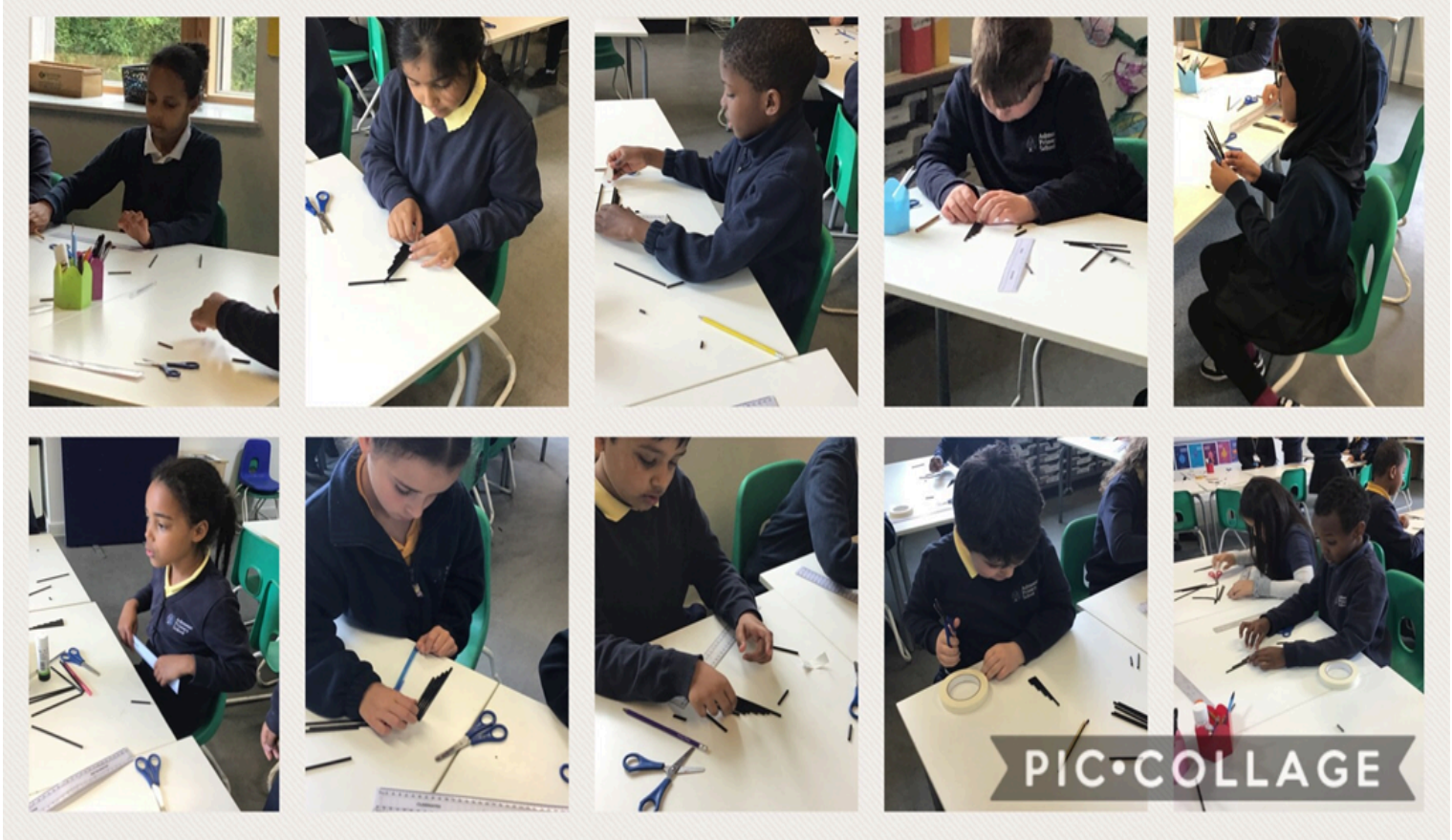
