Dear Parents/Guardians,

At Ashmount the safety and wellbeing of our children remains our highest priority.

Following a review of current arrangements, we have made changes to the booking process for the Walking Bus service to the Cape Adventure Playground.

From Monday 11th May 2026 bookings for the bus must be made via the "Walking Bus" option under clubs.

Parents/carers may book their child onto the Walking Bus on a daily basis, however all bookings must be completed by 13:15 on the day required. Unfortunately late requests will not be accepted.

Read Write Inc. starts in the first term of Reception and continues until a child progresses to our English program.

When children are ready they will bring home 'book bag books' to enjoy with parents and carers and reinforce their learning. Children should be reading at home independently or with an adult for a minimum of 15 minutes every day. Books will be changed in class according to a child's need. We also expect Reading Record books to be returned to class twice each week. Please remember to return all books sent home.

Chicken Club is a group of amazing volunteers who help care for the school chickens over the weekends.

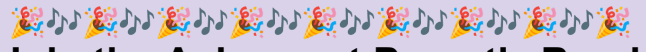
Any families with a child currently attending Ashmount can get involved.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
